

Managing COVID-19 at Seraph EFC

- 1) The Church is a place of worship, prayer, and refuge.
- 2) Unless there is a community-based infection and gathering of over a certain number of participants is prohibited by a new Manitoba Public Health Order, Sunday gatherings at Seraph will proceed at the regular time in the chapel in the new wing of WEFC.
- 3) Starting March 15, 2022, the Province no longer requires the use of masks, however we strongly recommend all participants to use masks and practice good hygiene. Please be aware there may be others in the WEFC not part of Seraph that may choose not to wear masks.
- 4) Servers (Worship team, Scripture reader, Room Set-up, Usher, Greeter, Projection, Audio) who cannot participate on any given Sundays, please kindly inform Pastor Nathan. Sunday School teachers who cannot participate on any given Sunday, please kindly inform Jennifer prior to Sunday.
- 5) All attendees are reminded to self-monitor prior to coming to church or fellowship gatherings.
- 6) Microphones, tech equipment will be wiped down with 70% alcohol after use.
- 7) Hand sanitizers are now standard at all entrances, including entrance at the chapel. Please use these whenever needed.
- 8) Sunday School for children has resumed. Physical distancing as well as the use of masks are encouraged when possible.
- 9) For communion, recipients of both the bread and cup will go by sections/rows to walk up to the assistants while maintaining physical distancing.
- 10) Fellowship gatherings are happening on alternative Sundays at church between 3:00 pm – 5:00 pm.
- 11) If you have not been vaccinated, we strongly recommended that you do that soon. This is to protect all the children and the vulnerable at church.
- 12) If you have returned from international travel by air or by land, please download the ArriveCAN app AND adhere to existing and evolving Public Health guidelines, monitoring yourselves for symptoms suggestive of respiratory infection. Symptoms are listed as follows: fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat, weakness, headache, difficulty breathing. - 13) If any of the symptoms applies to you, please contact [Health Links/Info Sante](#) at **204-788-8200** or toll-free **1-888-315-9257** to determine if testing for COVID-19 should be considered. In cases where testing is not recommended, you should self-isolate until you are well. You will need to inform everyone living with you at your location to self-isolate and have active daily monitoring. Only active cases will be tested by the Health Authorities.
